



Watercolor!





In *Yes, Please*, Amy Poehler shares hard-won wisdom and hilarious stories from her life in and out of the spotlight.





2025 ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear Neighbor,

I hope you've had the chance to stop in the library and see the result of the hard work of the last few years! In June we debuted our expanded Teen Room and three small individual study rooms. Our study rooms proved to be an instant success and the Teen Room opened with much excitement just in time for the busy summer reading season.

Staff also were busy seeking new ways to connect with our patrons, and within our community. Our staff ventured out of the library walls and into the community with Sunhat Storytime at the Valley Cottage Hamlet Green to Congers Lake with the On the Trail walking book club. Staff also presented at conferences, both national and regional, showcasing our innovative programs and staff talent. And along the way we won the RCLS Adult Program of the Year award and received community grants and NYS funding for construction projects. These spotlights are but a few examples of how the entire staff shined throughout 2025 and gave their hearts to our community.

On a beautiful October Sunday, a newly installed bench was dedicated to Tom Protus Sr. who passed in 2023 after dedicating more than 50 years to watching over the Valley Cottage Library. This bench, and its twin, were the result of the collection of over 2,000 pounds of plastic by the library's Sustainability Committee.

Looking back on the year is gratifying to see how much gets accomplished with the convergence of dedicated staff, a devoted board, and a supportive community. Thank you!
