





October 9: This Motherless Land by Nikki May

Led by Vara Neverow, **English Professor at** Southern Connecticut State University.

Moving between Somerset and Lagos over the course of two decades, This Motherless Land is a sweeping

examination of identity, culture, race, and love that asks how we find belonging and whether a family's generational wrongs can be righted.


Wednesday, December 3 at 6:30pm



October 26: Masterwork Conversations: Shall We Dance?

Presented by pianists Matthew Harrison and Vlada Yaneva. Moving to music is a primal instinct, a basic need to feel and move and express ourselves. From the pulse of our heart to the beat of our feet, we are guided by rhythm and inspired by melody. We dance alone, with a partner, and in long connected circles. We have always danced, we always will. In a matter of seconds, we can be transported from the dance

floor to Buenes Aires, and moments later to another time with its formal Baroque steps. We might be flying and turning with a partner swept up in a Viennese Waltz, or jumping and stomping in a Polish village to a lively mazurka. Join us as our fingers dance across eighty-eight keys and feel the urge to perhaps stand up yourself and take a step or two . . . shall we dance?



Part performance and part presentation, this appreciation class will break down a few components of what makes art song and opera aria so delicate, grandiose, and beautiful. We will touch briefly on the historical context, the musical context and the emotional psychological and human aspect of the music. In addition, I will be performing each of the songs that are talked about in the PowerPoint as well as additional music. So this will be a more immersive way of understanding, opera arias, and art songs through presentation and performance.

November 16: Classical Guitar with Jack Marcin

Jack Marcin Wisniewski is a Polish guitarist and composer whose musical journey began with a rescued guitar in 2000. He earned a Master's degree in classical guitar performance from the City University of New York and received a Fulbright Scholarship for music therapy research in Switzerland, where he collaborated with the Orchestra Mangolinistica di Lugano. As the bandleader of Grupo Aurora, he has been a vital force in New York's Latin music scene, blending traditional and contemporary sounds. In 2023 and 2024, he completed a world tour through Switzerland, Italy, USA, and Poland, submitted his recording Lágrima for Grammy nomination, and released his first CD, Clásico. His work has involved collaborations with the Polish Consulate in New York, The Ukrainian Institute Of America, and the Kosciuszko Foundation, showcasing his dedication to cultural diplomacy through music.
